## What is Beyond Bricks?

**Beyond Bricks** is Lego® Based Play that uses a 'recovery to discovery' approach, to enhance children's overall mental health and wellbeing, now and in the future. **Beyond Bricks** is brought to you by MindWise as part of Mental Health UK and funded by Lloyds Banking Group.

### **Beyond Bricks at a Glance**

Through our **Beyond Bricks** programme, we will work with primary schools to support P6/P7 pupils in discovering new skills which enable them to recover from the impact of the pandemic by developing a toolkit to maintain positive mental health now and in the future.

Delivered through Lego® Based play and interactive workshops, we want to support children of this age group who will be experiencing further changes and transition by focusing on learning about and building a toolkit to improve the five key aspects of emotional wellbeing in their own lives.











The five key aspects of emotional wellbeing as identified by the Education Authority 'Emotional Health and Wellbeing Framework' are:



Lego® Based Play teamed with interactive learning sessions brings about a unique learning experience where the children will develop essential skills through play, discussion, and testing what works for them.

Some of the skills each child will explore are:

- Communication Confidence
- Problem-solving skills Self-regulation
- Emotional development Advocacy Skills

### What does the Beyond Bricks programme involve?

Pupils will take part in a 5-week interactive programme in their school, with their own teachers co-facilitating the programme alongside trained **Beyond Bricks** Associates. Each pupil will leave with a personalised toolkit to support them in all five areas of the Emotional Health and Wellbeing Framework to navigate their future with confidence.

#### Each school will get:

- 4 assigned school staff members trained in Lego® Based Therapy.
- 5 one-hour Beyond Bricks workshops co-delivered with MindWise Training Associates for two different Primary 6 or Primary 7 classes within your school.
- A Lego® package: 20 sets of Lego® and 1 large creative brick box.
- A comprehensive package of easy to use resources, including a teacher's guide; PowerPoint slides for all workshops to facilitate teaching and pupil workbooks.
- Ongoing support and communication, allowing trained school staff to continue delivery with excellence in future.
- A Beyond Bricks celebratory event and certificate for your school showing your commitment to the programme.






### How we'll support you to deliver Beyond Bricks.

Before the programme is delivered to your pupils, we will train four of your school staff in Lego® Based Therapy and **Beyond Bricks**. In the following five weeks, our dedicated Training Associates will work closely with those staff to co-deliver **Beyond Bricks** in 1-hour workshops. Our Training Associates will be available to your school for 5 hours outside of the workshops, allowing for teachers to learn the content as well as prep, plan and debrief from the sessions.

Once **Beyond Bricks** has come to an end, we will remain in regular contact with your designated teachers to ensure they have the right resources and support to continue delivering **Beyond Bricks** to more pupils – and ultimately grow its impact within your school.











### Each session will last 1 hour and follow the same format exploring a new theme each week.

## What do we need from you to get started?

### **Capacity**

- Your ability to provide designated staff and teachers for the duration of the programme.
- Recruit 1 or 2 classes of P6 or P7 students for a 5 week programme.
- Deliver Beyond Bricks to another group of pupils in the school within one year of completing your co-delivery sessions.

#### Commitment

- Commitment to work with us to deliver a high quality programme for your pupils.
- To stay linked in with MindWise for support and feedback.
- Complete a short survey at the beginning, end, and one year on of your co-delivery sessions.









# MindWise Quality Standards for Beyond Bricks. Ensuring your school is ready for the programme.

We have developed some Quality Standards for **Beyond Bricks** to ensure we achieve its main objective:

'Pupils recover from the impact of the pandemic, through a recovery to discovery approach, to enhance their overall mental health and wellbeing, now and in the future.'

We are fortunate that we are in a position to be able to provide Beyond Bricks for free to a number of schools, and as such, we need to make sure we use these resources where the programme has the best conditions to make an impact.

These Standards are what we expect a school to appraise itself against prior to engaging with the programme, during delivery and in the future, in order to answer the question: "How do I ensure that my school is ready, committed and supported to deliver **Beyond Bricks** to the highest standard possible?"

#### Through the use of these quality standards, schools should be able to:

- a. Ensure they are prepared and ready to deliver Beyond Bricks.
- b. Deliver Beyond Bricks through trained designated school staff, ensuring it is always delivered by those who are trained in it.
- c. Allow Beyond Bricks to be delivered in the best school environment possible.
- d. Work collaboratively with Beyond Bricks Training Associates, understanding their role and utilising their capacity.
- e. Deliver Beyond Bricks only using approved materials and resources.
- f. Ensure that safeguarding and confidentiality are central to delivery.
- g. Commit to continuing the delivery of Beyond Bricks by delivering at least 1 further programme within 12 months of completion.

QS3: Collaborative Working Relationships  Beyond Bricks requires collaborative and supportive partnerships between designated school staff and Beyond Bricks Training Associates.	Collaborative working relationships are defined and planned during the training on the Beyond Bricks content.	Designated school staff are provided with sufficient time to utilise Beyond Bricks Training Associates for workshop prep, delivery and debrief. Understanding that our Beyond Bricks Training Associates are not risk or behaviour managers and this is the responsibility of the schools staff. Official Beyond Bricks resources/materials are only used during delivery Raise concerns about Beyond Bricks staff with the named lead for your school.	
QS4: Safeguarding and Confidentiality  Beyond Bricks holds safeguarding of all young people central to everything it does.	During the school staff training, the following should be covered: Presentation of safeguarding policies from the designated school staff and school safeguarding lead. Understanding of confidentiality and how it works during co-delivery. Clearly defined reporting system if something presents itself during co-delivery.	Delivery will only happen after school staff have been trained.  Adhere to your safeguarding policies which act as the lead document.	Referring to your safeguarding policy.  Contact Beyond Bricks staff if you have any difficulties.
